This may allow you to see how you can simplify and/ or shorten it for your young child's understanding.

Our Pastor Writes...

Holy Week represents the highest and holiest days of the church year, and with good reason. It remembers and celebrates the central events of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. All too often, Christians jump from the Triumphal Entry of Palm Sunday to the Empty Tomb of Easter without ever engaging the darker side of Holy Week.

Maundy Thursday is when we receive the Lord's Supper, just as Jesus served it on that Thursday evening of the first Holy Week. We will do that at 6:00 p.m. at Ardmore. It is a service of remembrance that foreshadows what is to come. Jesus knew the disciples (then, and now) would forget. So, he gave us the symbol of the bread and the cup to remember. Later that night, Jesus was arrested on trumped up charges; and thus, began what we refer to as the *passion*.

On that Friday, he was dragged before Herod and Pilate, beaten, scourged, and crucified. The same people who had hailed his entry on Sunday called for his death on Friday. His body was placed in a tomb. His disciples hid behind locked doors. From 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Friday the sanctuary will be available for all of us to visit the stations of the cross. This is a time to reflect upon Jesus' sacrifice, the violence done to him, and the reality of his death.

If we give ourselves to these two opportunities, how much grander will be the Easter morning celebration of the resurrection? As we bring flowers to decorate the cross in the church courtyard, we will enter to sing about and worship, not an empty tomb; but rather the Risen Christ. And because of that, we Christians are "Never Again the Same"!
