Questions About Coming Communications Improvements

Why the change?

We have heard that it takes 7-10 days to receive the Announcer by mail. The data from the website tells us that few people read the Announcer online. We finally got the message that we need a better information system!

Will we still get the weekly *Announcer*?

Not quite. We are introducing a weekly *QuickBits* print and e-mail publication that will focus on immediate need-to-knows. QuickBits will include a minister column, upcoming events, calls for ministry volunteers, and time sensitive information/notices.

How does this help me if I get the print *Announcer*?

We will have a print copy of QuickBits available by mail (only for those who don't have a family e-mail). Because it is brief, we will mail it first class, cutting delivery time from 7-10 days to 1-2 days. No more feeling left behind!

How does this help me if I get the e-mail Announcer?

QuickBits will be concise and focused. You will be able to read it within an e-mail and scan it quickly for what you need to know. And it will be mobile device friendly.

So what about the *Announcer*?

The four-page *Announcer* will turn into a monthly print and e-mail-accessible piece that will focus on longer interest articles and pictures. In addition, data like attendance and stewardship figures will be presented for an entire month so you can see changes over time. It will be offered as a mailed print piece and via e-mail link exactly like the current *Announcer*. It will still take a while to receive the print Announcer but the focus on longer articles will be less affected by time constraints. It also won't be mobile friendly but the new format will be better suited for larger digital devices anyway.

What if I want to change from print to e-mail now that it will be easier to read weekly information?

You can change your preference to receive QuickBits and the Announcer from print to e-mail by contacting Debra Norris (dnorris@ardmorebaptist.org). We encourage everyone with an e-mail address to give it a try.
