Equipping the Saints

This past fall I had the privilege and blessing of walking through the New Testament letter of Ephesians with a group of you on Wednesday nights. Ephesians is about unity and Paul gives some practical advice for marriages, families, and churches.

When it comes to pastors, Paul draws some clear lines about what the primary role of a minister should be: The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ. (Ephesians 4:11-12) The more I studied those verses and the themes within Ephesians as



a whole, the more I felt the Holy Spirit moving and working within my own soul.

I have a confession to make to you all: I don't think I've been doing this very well as your pastor. I do not think I have been effectively living into my calling to be an equipper.

Now, much of that is probably due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. When it became clear how vastly altered all of our lives were going to become due to this disease, the rest of the ministers at Ardmore and I moved into what I've called, "triage mode." Those of you in the medical community know that "triage" refers to treating the most dire and gaping wounds before moving on to less serious conditions in a body. When we moved into this "triage mode" we had to make decisions quickly and as efficiently as possible. We had neither the time nor the possibility of convening our normal meeting structures; we had to make decisions on the fly.

There are seasons in a church's life when that kind of leadership is necessary. But it is never meant to be permanent. Instead, a pastor's job is not to be a domineering leader who imposes their vision on the church. A pastor's job is to be a shepherd who equips the saints (that means y'all!) for the work of ministry. In this stirring memoir, The Pastor, Eugene Peterson says this about the calling of a minister: "My work is not to fix people. It is to lead people in the worship of God and to lead them in living a holy life" (137). So, during the pandemic we have managed to accomplish some wonderful things as a congregation and we should celebrate those things. But I don't want us to stay in "triage mode."

In 2022, my goal and my commitment to you is to work on being your pastor by equipping you for the work of the Gospel in your own soul and in the world (and in that order).

Missions Survey Results

Over the summer of 2021 the Missional Engagement MALT and Mission Resources Team asked the Ardmore Baptist Church community to take a missions survey. You may be wondering what we learned from those responses and what we did with the information. Below are some highlights from what we gleaned. Please feel free to reach out to Amy Gallaher, Minister of Missional Engagement; Brooke Preslar, Chair of Missional Engagement MALT; or Lisa Turner, Chair of Missions Resources Team, with any questions or for more information.

Findings:

- The top three issues responders want to see ABC involved in missionally are: Poverty/Homelessness, Refugees/Immigration, and Racial Justice.
- Most responders are unaware that ABC partners with and supports over 18 different organizations. Most are aware of church involvement with three to five of those organizations.
- The top five organizations we partner with, which are also personally supported by church members with their own resources, are: Partnership Missions (CBF, IMB, NAMB, CBFNC), PIVOT Ministry, Crisis Control of Winston Salem, CBF Field Personnel Janee Angel and Hary Khano in Antwerp, Belgium.
- Most responders can get behind any organization or issue that helps our congregation share the life and love of lesus Christ with others.

Goals for Missions at Ardmore:

- 1. Supporting the sharing of Jesus Christ.
- 2. Going deeper in impact and wider in giving.
- 3. Balancing involvement in local, state, national, and international missions.
- 4. Avoiding duplication in giving to multiple organizations that do the same thing.
- 5. Using level of current engagement as barometer instead of history.
- 6. Looking for intergenerational opportunities with great breadth across age groups for serving, involvement, and education.
